- **Membership referral program**

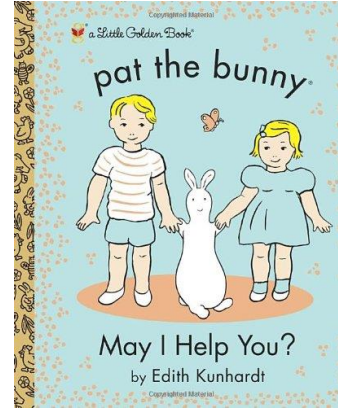

Monthly Book Shoutouts

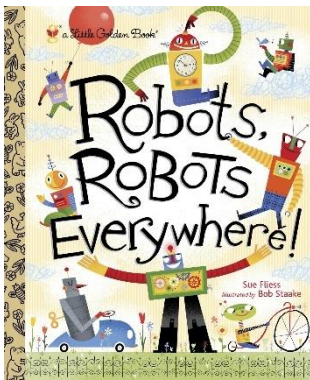
1. PAT THE BUNNY MAY I HELP YOU (by Edith Kunhardt)

For ages 2-5, this book is about two children Paul, Judy and Bunny their parents in and around the house, with chores and various housework. The book helps children learn courteous and kind and how to help in the house. With little questions on each page, the point to pictures to help the characters do their chores or answer about themselves and have fun in the process of learning. 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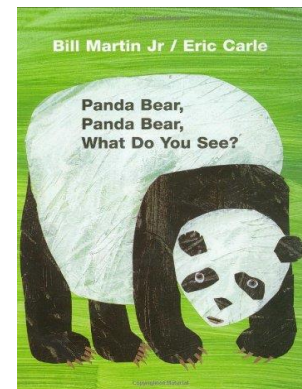
2. ROBOTS, ROBOTS EVERYWHERE! (By Sue Fliess)

For ages 2-5, this book is a tribute to animal conservation efforts and children learn about endangered animal species and how they move. The bright collage illustrations also show where they live, in the skies, in the seas, on land. Children will enjoy answering the classic question of "What do you see?" and guessing what animal comes next.
